## Follow the Star

# Trust

### December 3

God's word invites us to trust Him—to place our lives at His mercy and surrender our own agenda. It can be a scary thought. But because in Christ, God became one of us, fully experiencing the hurts of humanity, we can be sure that we have a savior who is worthy of trust. Write down a circumstance where you need to more completely trust God. Invite Him into this part of your life.

The Bible tells us of Magi who came from the east, following the star in search of a newborn King. We get just a glimpse of their story, but we know they acted with wisdom, foresight and perseverance to achieve their Godordained purpose. Are there life-situations where you need supernatural wisdom? Write a prayer asking in faith for God to provide it.

## December 5

Tradition holds that Mary rode to Bethlehem on a donkey. However they traveled, for Joseph and Mary the journey must've seemed to last forever. Even through uncertain circumstances, they had no choice but to practice patience and let events unfold in God's timing. How will you intentionally slow down and wait on Christ this advent season?

Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem,...to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. -Luke 2:4-6



### December 6



Mary was forced to find her way through a maze of dismaying circumstances. Yet in the midst of the unknown, she chose to serve the Lord through her faith and obedience. As you prepare for the coming of Christ, the ultimate servant, ask God where you can serve in obedience in the days ahead.

### December 7

### December 9

## CHRISTMAS STAR FOR KIDS

Christmas is a wonder-filled time for children. Whether you're a mom or grandpa, or a babysitter for your neighbors, each week we'll share a kid-friendly craft or idea to help introduce the littles in your life to Advent. Let's get to it for week one.

## WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- Christmas Star template download at bit.ly/homefrontstars
- Yarn or twine (approximately 25 feet for each star)
- Cardboard, cotton balls or batting, glue gun & glue sticks, hole punch, scissors

## WHAT YOU'LL DO

- 1. Download and cut out the Christmas Star template.
- 2. Trace the star onto cardboard and cut around the edges.
- 3. If you're using batting, cut two pieces of star-shaped batting per ornament.
- 4. Make a hole in one of the points of the cardboard star with the hole-punch.
- 5. Loop a small piece of twine through the hole. This will be your ornament hanger.
- 6. Hot-glue the batting or cotton balls to both sides of the star-shaped cardboard.
- 7. Place a small drop of hot glue on the tip of one the star points to attach one end of the twine or yarn and begin wrapping the star.
- 8. Continue wrapping the star, periodically placing hot glue in spots where the twine or yarn may slip.
- 9. Once the star is completely wrapped, use a small drop of glue to secure the end of the twine or yarn.

Ask the Holy Spirit who He might lead you to invite to join you in worship this year. Then make the invitation and trust God with the outcome.

## Star

### December 13

Was it a comet, an alignment of planets or something entirely supernatural? The Bible doesn't give us the astronomical details, but we know that God chose a light in the night sky to herald the birth of His Son. The book of 1st John tells us God Himself is light (1 John 1:5). What areas of darkness in your life need to be illuminated by His light today?

When the wise men set eyes on Christ, they immediately fell into a posture of worship. Their long-awaited moment of worship came at a personal price. They carried lavish gifts, traveled far from home and risked defying an earthly ruler. Their story reminds us that prioritizing worship often involves sacrifice. As you anticipate the birth of Christ, how will you make worship a priority even if it carries a cost?

What's in a name? One of the names given to Christ in the scriptures is Immanuel, which comes from a Hebrew phrase meaning, "God with us." This name conveys the miracle that in Christ, the creator of the universe chose to come close, to dwell with you and me. Write a prayer inviting God to be present with you in the joys and suffering you will face today.

## Arrival

### December 16

Through Advent we look back at Christ's coming as a Bethlehem babe. Yet at the same time, we look forward to His second coming. Let us wait eagerly and expectantly for a glimpse of His coming glory, like a child trying for a peek at her presents before Christmas morning. Reflect on Christ's return today. Thank Him in anticipation for what is to come.



So Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him. -Hebrews 9:28

## KIDS' CHRISTMAS CARD PRAYERS

- Find a spot to display Christmas cards from friends and family as they arrive. Spend time enjoying and reading the cards with the kids.
- 2. Take the cards down in January when things aren't so busy. Place them in a basket or napkin holder where you will see them daily, perhaps at the kitchen table.
- 3. With the children, pick one card or letter each day and pray for the sender.
- 4. Optional: Send a note, text, or email to your friends and let them know you and the kids prayed for them. Don't let this step keep you from praying if you don't have time to write a note!
- 5. Ask God which people or situations He's laying on your heart. In addition to praying, is there a way to include the kids in providing help, lending a listening ear, or sharing the joy with your friends?
- 6. Include the kids in thanking God for the people He's brought into your life!

## Love

## December 17

In the stable where Christ was born, it's likely that there was blood dripping to the ground. At the cross where he gave his life, blood was there too. The life and death of Jesus are marked by sacrificial love. We're called to emulate His example. Ask God if there are new ways He might call you to love in ways that are uncomfortable or sacrificial in the days ahead.

How do you express gratitude when you receive a Christmas gift? Sometimes heartfelt words are best, other times perhaps a hug or a Thank You card are called for. Christ is the free love-gift from God to us. As we prepare to celebrate this precious gift, what are some ways, through your thoughts, words and actions, that you can begin to express thankfulness for this ultimate gift?

## World

## December 19

Christ drew his first breath in Bethlehem more than two millennia ago. Although his life on earth was rooted in a specific time and place, his grace and love cover all of humanity throughout all time. We're called to reflect his care for people all over the world. Ask God to give you a heart for people across the globe and ways to actively demonstrate His heart for them.

December 20

We live in a world where conflict seems constant and peace seems far away. Yet God's word intertwines the idea of peace on earth with the announcement of Christ's birth. What reassurance does this bring to your heart? As a disciple of Christ, how might this influence your actions and attitudes?

## Fear

### December 21

Angels changed the shepherds' world that night with the headline: The King of Love is coming! The angels' opened their speech by telling the shepherds not to fear and the book of 1st John declares that God's perfect love casts out fear. What fears is the Lord calling you to cast aside this advent season? Write a prayer inviting God to take them from you.

They were filled with great fear. And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people." -Luke 2:9-10



## Gather

December 22

When we think of the church, we often think of a building. But a clearer picture of the church is simply the people of God gathering in community. Christ is with us even when just a few of us gather. Perhaps the magi worshipping Christ was the first Christian church service—messy and unconventional as it probably was. As you prepare to celebrate this Christmas, how will you focus on gathering with God's people?

## Refuge

### December 23

Christ was born in a barn and buried in a borrowed tomb. Mary gave birth in Bethlehem because an occupying empire forced her to make the journey. Later, their family fled to Egypt as refugees. Today there are people in our city and around the world who are oppressed, poor and marginalized. Pray for them and ask God how He would have you intervene in their plight.

An angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you, for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him." -Matthew 2:13



### December 24



Christ could have come to earth as a conquering warrior or an emperor with riches and fame. Yet He chose the path of a peasant, helpless and humble. In our culture, too often we find ourselves thirsting for prestige and drowning in comparison. Ask the Father to show you how you can emulate Christ's humility this Christmas.



"And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." -Luke 2:12

## FOLLOW THE STARS

## WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- Glow-in-the-dark stars to create a path from your child's room to the Christmas tree
- Bible
- Nativity set that includes Mary, Joseph, a donkey, other animals, an angel, a shepherd, wise men, and baby Jesus

## PREP

- When the kids are in bed, make a trail of stars from their rooms to the Christmas tree.
- Place different pieces of the nativity set long the path, ending with baby Jesus.
- Place a cake (maybe angel food!) with three candles on top near the end of the trail.
- A cake with a candle

## CHRISTMAS MORNING

- 1. When the kids wake up, help them follow the stars like the wise men did.
- 2. At the first stop, find Mary, Joseph and a donkey & read Luke 2:1-5. Collect the figurines as you go to the next stop.
- 3. Continue following the trail of stars to the animals and read Luke 2:6-7.
- 4. Find the angels and shepherds at the next stop and read Luke 2:8-20.
- 5. Follow the trail to where the wise men wait and read Matthew 2:1-2, 9-11.
- 6. Approach the tree and have the kids focus on baby Jesus as you light a candle on the cake. Remind the kids that Jesus is the light of the world and that His birthday is the reason we celebrate.
- 7. Finish the search with worship by singing "Silent Night" or "Happy Birthday" to Jesus. Then blow out the candle and enjoy the cake.
