Summer in the Psalms – Week 4

Preacher: Pastor Korey

Focus Passages: Psalm 119:105; Acts 20:22–26

Belong

Before GPS, how did you find your way on road trips—or did you?

Leader Transition (Read Aloud): This week, Pastor Korey shared a powerful message about trusting God's direction and stepping forward in faith. Using Psalm 119:105 and Acts 20:22–26, he reminded us that God's Word lights the next step—not the whole map—and that obedience often means moving forward even when the outcome is unclear. The relaunch of our Debary campus is an opportunity to carry the hope, worship, and outreach of our church into a new season of ministry. Let's dig into these Scriptures and reflect on how God might be leading each of us to take part.

Believe

1. Read Psalm 119:105. What does this verse teach us about the way God leads us?

Leader Note: God doesn't promise a spotlight—He gives a lamp. His Word provides enough light for the next faithful step. We follow Him by trusting what He's already shown us.

2. Based on Acts 20:22, how does Paul model obedience to God's leading, even without all the details?

Leader Note: Paul is "bound" or "compelled" by the Spirit. He doesn't know exactly what will happen, but he's already decided to follow. That's trust in action.

3. **Read Acts 20:24.** What does this verse reveal about Paul's priorities and how should it challenge us today?

Leader Note: Paul's priority is finishing the assignment God gave him, not selfpreservation. It challenges us to view our lives as part of God's greater mission, not just our personal comfort. 4. In light of Psalm 119 and Acts 20, how do you think God is calling First Baptist Orlando to live out these truths in Debary?

The church is stepping forward in obedience, trusting God's light for each step. Like Paul, they're carrying hope, truth, and worship into a new place—even if there are unknowns.

Become

1. What's one area of your life where you need to trust God with the next step—even if the whole path isn't clear?

Leader Note: This could be related to work, relationships, ministry, or personal growth. Psalm 119:105 encourages us to walk in step with God's Word, even when we can't see the full picture.

2. Would you consider being part of the Debary launch team? If not going, how can you help send others and support them?

Leader Note: This is a personal reflection and group challenge. Not everyone will go, but everyone can pray, give, and encourage. The Great Commission always involves both goers and senders. Prayer is the first step—pray for leadership, future members, and open hearts. Supporting could also mean spreading the word, encouraging others, or donating resources.

Leader Closing Encouragement:

Pastor Korey reminded us: God lights the way, and He invites us to walk with Him. Whether you're considering joining the Debary team or simply taking your next step of obedience, know this—God is already ahead of you. Let's be a church that listens, prays, and responds in faith.
